

# 2025 FRIENDS OF SCOUTING FAMILY CAMPAIGN GUIDEBOOK

Dear Unit Leader,

Thank you for the important leadership you provide to the youth of the Hawkeye Area Council, Boy Scouts of America! Your efforts have had a positive impact on our youth and local communities.

#### What is the Friends of Scouting (FOS) Campaign?

Friends of Scouting is the Hawkeye Area Council's annual fundraising campaign that helps support year-round youth programs and Scout camp.

To keep Scouting affordable for families, our Family Friends of Scouting campaign goal = \$103,000.

#### Friends of Scouting donations help fund:

- **Camp**: the Howard H. Cherry Scout Reservation property is owned and maintained by your local Council.
- Youth programs and activities: leadership experience, STEAM opportunities, character development, citizenship, outdoor adventures and more!
- **Staff:** professional, administrative, and camp staff supports 1,100 volunteers and over 2,000 scouting families in Eastern Iowa.

In 2025, the cost per Scout to the Council = \$623 (total expenses/# of youth served).

Friends of Scouting donations keep program expenses and camp at a more economical rate, so the entire cost is NOT passed on to families.

FOS donations are spent the same year as they are received to offset local program expenses. Donations are not used for the National office.

#### How can you help?

- Share the benefits of Scouting and how "we are building better lowans and leaders of tomorrow."



Goal: invite 100% of our units and families to consider supporting FOS.

- Schedule your unit's FOS presentation.

  (Every family deserves the opportunity to learn more about supporting their local scouting programs).
- Appoint a Unit FOS contact for presentation coordination and follow-up.
- The presentation will be conducted by a volunteer.
  - This presenter is a unit or district volunteer who inspires leaders, parents, and relatives of your Scouts to invest in the Scouting program.
  - They will share a personal Scouting story and ask families to consider "making an investment in the next generation of leaders".

## **How Your Unit Can Support Friends of Scouting (FOS)**

#### **Unit Presentation**

Committee Chairs & Cub/Scoutmasters will be contacted by the District FOS volunteer or District Executive to schedule a presentation December 2024 – April 2025.

A volunteer will explain why it is important to support the local campaign and the unit's goals at the presentation. Families and Unit Leaders will be asked to make a tax-deductible pledge to support their local Hawkeye Area Council.





# How Local Scouting Programs are Funded



#### **Hawkeye Area Council Investments:**

- Maintenance of the Howard H. Cherry Scout Reservation Camp
- Council Service Center program support
- Scout Shop: recognition items, advancement, uniforms, equipment, training, etc.
- Insurance to protect Scouts & Scouters
- Processing of registration, advancement & Eagle Scout applications.
- Program and activity supplies
- Incentive & recognition items



#### **Local Unit Investments:**

- Unit activities such as camping, Pinewood Derby races, etc.
- Program supplies for unit activities.
- Equipment such as camp stoves, tents, rockets, pinewood derby tracks, etc.
- Advancements & awards



## What Will a Presentation Look Like in 2025?

- 1. In-Person at a Pack's Blue/Gold Banquet or Troop's Court of Honor.
  - a. Unit leader or volunteer presenter explains the importance of Friends of Scouting (total presentation = 10 minutes!)
  - b. Use the PowerPoint presentation & promotional video.
  - c. Explain the matching gifts program:
    - i. The donor must request the matching gift form from his or her employer.

## d. Explain the incentive program for units and individuals:

- i. Individuals will receive:
  - FOS 2025 Shoulder Patch (\$365)
  - Art Print of a Scene at Camp (\$750)
  - Framed Art Print of a Scene at Camp (\$1500)
  - Leadership Giving Gold Leaf (\$2,500)
  - Leadership Giving Platinum Leaf (\$5,000)
- ii. Units can earn the President's Award (personalized form)

## e. Collection of donations/pledges:

- i. In-Person = collect pledge cards and distribute incentive items.
  - 1. It is vital that the presenter returns the FOS envelope to the Council office within 1 week of the presentation!

# Frequently Asked Questions—Common Misconceptions

1. "I pay dues to my unit. Doesn't that cover the Council too?"

No, the Council does not receive any funds from your unit dues or registration.

2. "We pay for summer camp. Why do I need to donate further?"

The fees charged for Council camps are only a fraction of the total annual cost of owning and maintaining the properties and running programs.

# **Early Planning**

- Contact the unit coordinator at least a week in advance to verify the location, date, and time of the meeting.
- Request that your presentation be scheduled right after opening remarks.
- Ask who will be introducing you at the meeting.
- Have an area designated for the FOS tool kit and materials.
  - Ask about audio/visual equipment. Make sure if you are presenting in a large room, a microphone and speaker are available.

- A Council staff member can provide the unit's giving for the previous year.
- Be prepared to explain how to complete the pledge card in the brochure.
  - The QR Code is generic.
  - Instruct parents to scan the code and enter the unit # in the comments field.

#### Your Presentation

The reason you are making this presentation is to provide everyone with the opportunity to participate in supporting the Scouting program!

- Bring your presentation notes and a blank brochure/pledge card up to the stage with you.
- Allow 5-10 minutes for your presentation.
- Make it personal & meaningful!
  - Share how scouting has positively impacted you, your family, or someone you know.
- Explain how to complete the pledge card.
  - o Donor wants to pay later?
    - Note the total gift and how they want to be billed.
- Collect all pledge cards.
  - Someone doesn't want to contribute?
    - Enter \$0 so the office will not follow-up with them again this year.
- Remind everyone that families who were not present will be contacted afterwards for an opportunity to participate.
- Thank the group for their attentiveness and time.
